Your Decorating Problems Answered
By BEN L. WALLACE, Decorator

Mr. Wallace: I would like to mix some pieces of French Provincial dining room in with my Colonial furniture. Can I do this successfully?—Mrs. T. J., Lomita.

Mrs. T. T.: The question is twofold. First I would say that if you have a separate dining room, yes, it can be done in good taste. But if you are going to mix provincial and colonial in the same general room, then there is too much of a style-break and it would not be advisable. Stay with all one style unless you have a separate dining room.

They are not only comfortable but they are practical (ask any baby). Also my advice to you is if you like the rocker, stay with it and let your friends be friends and not decorators.

Mr. Ben Wallace: I have an extremely long, narrow room approximately 13x29. It is very hard to furnish because one end of the room is our dining room, which I don't care for, but I must live with. I have always wanted a sectional, but I do not have any wall space for it unless I block part of the end of the dining area approximately six feet. Can this be done and still look all right?—Mrs. T. F. C., Torrance.

Mrs. T. F. C.: Your problem is not uncommon at all in the decorating business. From the general classification of your room, I would suggest you use a decorative divider on the end of the room that is the dining room.
