**Honey Ice Cream Float**

1 cup chilled milk  
3 tablespoons honey  
½ cup vanilla ice cream

Combine milk and honey. Add ice cream and stir until part of ice cream is dissolved. Serve. Makes one serving.

Honey Old Timers are fitting in both name and substance for those who bridge the years from "bees" to "clubs."

**Honey Old Timers**

1½ cups sifted all purpose flour  
1½ teaspoons baking powder  
¾ teaspoon salt  
¾ teaspoon cinnamon  
½ tablespoons chopped nuts  
¼ cup chopped candied or dried fruit  
¼ cup margarine or butter  
¼ cup sugar

½ cup honey  
1 egg yolk, beaten  
1 teaspoon vanilla

Sift together flour, baking powder, salt and cinnamon; stir in nuts and candied fruit. Cream margarine or butter; beat in sugar and honey; then egg yolk and vanilla; gradually stir in flour-nut-fruit mixture. Some honey causes more spreading than others; add more flour if necessary.

Drop batter from teaspoon onto greased baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) 10 to 12 minutes. If desired, mix ½ teaspoon orange rind with a little sugar and spread on cookies while still hot. Place 3 raisins
