John Broe to Participate in Research Project

John R. Broe, a counselor and instructor at El Camino College, is one of five science teachers to be selected by the University of Vermont as a participant in its summer research program under sponsorship of the National Science Foundation.

In this project, cooperating persons memorize certain pieces of prose. The investigators then try to determine from the data predictions how much the subjects of the experiments will remember. In his work with Dr. Slamecka, Broe will familiarize himself with the scope of the project and will study the data for indications and prediction of retention.

The eight-week program at the university provides participants the opportunity of working with faculty members on research in progress and enables them to earn up to six hours of graduate credit. The program director is Howard M. Smith Jr., professor of electrical engineering and coordinator of research.


