THE GALLERY, 335 W. SEVENTH, SAN PEDRO

With some twenty paintings in gouache and oil, Dr. Arthur J. Schneider is now exhibiting selected works pointing up periods in his artistic development covering two decades. The changing style of Schneider's painting parallels the development stages of modern art in America.

The current exhibition of his work at The Gallery, begins with "Anima" and the Gauguinesque series of gouaches accounting for five extraordinary months in matriarchal Tehuantepec. His return to metropolitan New York shows a shift from the lyrical to the dynamic in works as "Whirlpool," "Taxi," "Human Plant," "Malguena," and "Three Women." Schneider's migration westward in 1949 is then pointed up in abstractions as "Medicine Man," "Desert Image," and "Phoenix." In California since 1950, his current period opens up with "Siesta," and "Advancing Horizon," and matures in "Midnight Oil," "Seaweed," "Image of Inner Space," and his most recent quintich, "Solar Image," and "Cosmic Fire."

Viking Trackmen Win 1961 Metropolitan Title

Long Beach City Track and Field team copped the 1961 annual Metro Conference meet last weekend at Long Beach and with the win the championship crown. The Vikings, from Long Beach, coached by Joe Lanning and assisted by Jim Strangeland, scored 89 1/2 points in the annual affair while Valley College scored 75 1/2 points and Bakersfield 71 1/2.

Other Metropolitan Conference college scores were: San Diego CC 58; East L. A. College 47; El Camino College 38 1/2; Santa Monica CC 34 1/2; and Harbor 20 1/4.

Metropolitan Conference track and field athletes competed in the West Coast relays yesterday at Fresno, and will vie in the Southern California Junior College meet on May 16 and 20. Certain Southern Cal preliminary events will be held on Tuesday, May 16 at Santa Monica City College, while the finals are scheduled for Bakersfield College on Saturday, May 20.

The State J C Track and Field Meet is scheduled for Saturday, May 27 at Modesto. Last week's Metropolitan Conference meet was highlighted by three record-breaking performances and a tieing of another. Included in the four topnotch performances were two by the fabulous Dee Andrews of Long Beach City College.

Andrews broke the Metro broad jump mark by leaping 25' 2 1/4". The old record of

24' 11 1/2" was held by Henk Visser of Bakersfield College. Andrews also tied the current Metro 220 low hurdle mark of 23.1 set by Willie White of Harbor in 1957. Steve Matthews, of Valley, accounted for a new mile record of 4:20.2 set by Neville Shaw, from Bakersfield, in 1959. In the other record breaking performance last Friday, George Fleckenstein, of Santa Monica CC, high jumped 6' 6 1/2" breaking the old mark of 6' 6 1/4" held by Frank Washington of East L. A. College.

Underwater Swim Equipment Shown August 4, 5, 6

Underwater devices still in the experimental stage and skindiving equipment from a dozen countries will be featured in the first show of its kind devoted to the popular Southern California sport, August 4, 5 and 6, it was announced this week by H. L. Dunnigan, Jr., of Production Projects Ltd., sponsors of the event.

Designed to attract the estimated 300,000 skindivers in the greater Los Angeles area and the general watersport public, the 1961 Pacific Coast Skindiving Show will be held at the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium, Dunnigan said.

"While some of the experimental items to be exhibited have military and scientific applications, it's likely that in a few years they may be just as practical as the other equipment and accessories in the show," he said.

Warrior Golfers Finish Sixth in Metro Finale

Spencer Beard's low scoring 75-71 round in the Metropolitan Conference finale Monday netted the youthful El Camino golfer a second place in the season-end tournament and the chance to represent the Warriors in the state tournament in San Francisco tomorrow.

Beard's 146-total round was just three shots short of the winning score posted by Long Beach's Larry Griggs. The El Camino team finished sixth in scoring with 971 strokes.

Long Beach, 1961 conference winner, won the year-end tourney with a 902 total stroke count. Next in line were San Diego, 930; Santa Monica, 934; East Los Angeles, 942; Bakersfield, 947; El Camino, 971; Los Angeles Valley, 1021 and Harbor.

El Camino coach Al Green-

leaf won the low net coaches' scoring of the event with an 82 round. Other El Camino scoring went down on the cards as John Kelly, 77-77-154; Les Warr, 82-78-160; Rich Watson, 83-82-165; Richard Loretta, 85-83-168; and Richard Hansen, 88-90-178.

The warriors finished the regular season with an 8 and 6 record that netted the six golfers a Metropolitan third spot.
