

USAF Needs Therapists

Opportunities are again available for qualified men and women occupational therapists and women physical therapists to be commissioned in the U.S. Air Force's medical specialist corps. MSgt. James P. LeFevre, local AF recruiter said today.

Details of the program can be obtained from MSgt James P. LeFevre at the USAF Recruiting Office, 1319 1/2 Sartori Street, Torrance.

Therapists selected by the Air Force will immediately enter active duty in the rank of 2nd Lt. to Capt., depending on age and experience. After a six-week officer orientation course at Gunter AFB, Alabama, they will be reassigned to a modern USAF hospital in the United States or overseas.

TEAM

As members of the Aerospace Team, these officers will be concerned with rehabilitation. Their programs complement each other in providing treatment for Air Force personnel and their families who are mentally or physically disabled. This variety in clientele provides the Air Force therapist with broad professional experience.

Both therapists work under the direction and supervision of a physician to provide the various activities which will increase muscle strength, improve co-ordination, increase joint motion and assist with social and mental adjustment.

During their Air Force careers they can expect to attend short courses and complete advanced professional training.

Summer Camp For Blind Children Slated

Applications are now being accepted for Camp Bloomfield, only summer camp for blind children in the entire Southwestern United States, which will open July 1 and continue to Sept. 1, it was announced today by Norman Kaplan, executive director of the Foundation for the Junior Blind, the non-profit corporation which operates the camp located in the Malibu Mountains, 20 miles north of Los Angeles.

"We welcome all blind and partially sighted youngsters between the ages of 6 and 21, regardless of race, creed or color, at Camp Bloomfield," Kaplan said. "There is no fee charged to the children. Interested individuals and organizations contribute the necessary funds which operate the camp."

Swimming, hiking, fishing, boating, baseball—all the activities usually associated with "seeing" camps are participated in by the children at Camp Bloomfield. "To be able to do all these things which sighted children do instills a great deal of self-confidence in the blind boy or girl," Kaplan stated.

ACCREDITED

The local vocational nursing program, consisting of three semesters' study and nursing experience at Harbor College and Harbor Hospital,

is accredited by the California State Board of Vocational Nurses. The program qualifies the graduate for the state licensing examination and for many employment opportunities in the Harbor Area and elsewhere.

Applications for admission to the September class are now being considered. Since it is necessary to limit the number of students admitted to each class, men and women interested in enrolling are urged to apply to Roberta Lindberg at Harbor General Hospital before July 1.
