Senator Proposes Federal Boxing Comm. Be Formed

State athletic authorities need the help of a national boxing commissioner to drive racketeers and gangsters out of boxing, Senator Clair Engle (D-Calif.) told a Senate subcommittee this week.

The California senator said the Kefauver committee investigations revealed a shocking picture: "That in professional boxing today the question is not how good you are but who you pay off to prove how good you are."

He said state boxing commissions have made "valiant attempts" to clean up corruption, but added, "They can get nowhere in these efforts because they are stymied by the interstate aspects of the business."

Senator Engle explained, "Managers and boxers found to be engaged in corrupt practices in one state can continue to ply their profession with impunity by the simple expediency of setting up business in the next state."

The problem is compounded by the fact that television and theater films of boxing bouts—one of the largest sources of income—are sold nationwide and are beyond the control of state authorities.

KEFAUVER'S BILL

Senator Engle said he is co-author of new legislation, S. 1474 by Senator Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.), which will provide a solution by creating a national boxing commissioner in the U.S. Department of Justice.

He explained that the national boxing commissioner would in no way preempt either a state's authority or its responsibility to regulate professional boxing.

"The Commissioner's office is primarily a licensing authority and would be largely excluded from the administration, supervision and con-

duct of boxing matches," he said.

Senator Engle told the committee that Governor Edmund G. Brown of California and California Attorney General Stanley Mosk have endorsed the proposal.

He quoted a letter from Governor Brown to Senator Kefauver in which Brown said, "The fact is that no matter how stringent are the rules our State Commission adopts, it cannot eliminate the hoodlum influence from the boxing business without Federal assistance."

Senator Engle pointed out that S. 1474 limits the life of the proposed national boxing commissioner to a period of five years.

Football Preview Scheduled at LA Coliseum July 26

Southern Californians will get their annual preview of collegiate football in the making on Wednesday, July 26, at Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum when the tenth annual Shrine North-South football classic and pageant is unfolded, beginning at 7:45 p.m.

Net proceeds from the game will be devoted to Los Angeles unit of Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children.

Tickets are on sale at the Shrine Football Office, 655 West Jefferson, at \$5, \$3, and \$1.50. Sales are also being handled by individual Shriners through the unformed organizations and Shrine Clubs.

Preceded by an hour and 15 minutes of pageantry, parades, bands, and special events, kick-off for the game will be at 9 a.m.

Fifty players, representing Northern and Southern California, were selected last January by two committees of sports writers to participate in the Classic.
