Schools to Borrow Cars for Driving Students Now

Ford Motor Company moved today to make it easier for schools to borrow new cars for use in teaching students to drive.

James O. Wright, vice president-car and truck group, said Ford is doubling the amount of its rebate to dealers for new units loaned to schools for use in driver-training programs.

At present, 2,689 Ford and Lincoln-Mercury dealers are participating in the program to provide cars for driver training. Of the 3,912 units now supplied by these dealers for driver-training, 2,663 are loaned.

The remainder are either bought or leased by the schools or program sponsors.

In 1956, Ford became the first company in the automobile industry to install front seat belts and padded dashboards and visors on all its products used for driver training. Ford supplies seat belts without charge on driver-training units.

The National Safety Council recently awarded Ford a bronze plaque for its 1960 series of motion pictures on driver education. The films, a joint effort of the company's motion picture department and traffic safety and highway improvement department, are entitled "City Driving," "Driving Under Special Conditions," and "High Speed Conditions," and "Special Driving."
