Detroyers, long known as the "workhorse of the fleet," are used by the Navy for anti-submarine warfare, speedy rescues at sea and escorting larger ships, such as troop transports or aircraft carriers.

The Kearsarge can best be compared to a "floating city," having a population of more than 1,800 men. It has a chapel, dining halls, clothing stores, cobbler shop, tailor shop, library, power plants, a modern fully equipped hospital, printing plant and all other facilities necessary to efficiently operate a city of its size.

Part of the Kearsarge aerial arsenal, which includes many types of modern jet aircraft, is the small, propeller-driven, twin-engine Gruman "Tracker," used to skim over the waves searching for submarines with advanced electronic gear.
