A live audio report on the U.S. unmanned orbital space shot tentatively scheduled this week will be broadcast on the "Today" show (NBC-TV Network, 7-9 a.m., PDT and CDT).

NBC News will cover the launch at Cape Canaveral with correspondents Roy Neal and Ray Barberee. Films taken by NBC News will be shown on regular TV news programs later in the day.

Launch of the Mercury capsule is scheduled for 5 a.m. PDT. Neal's reports will be on the "Today" show and Barberee's coverage over the NBC Radio Network at 5 a.m. PDT.


