

# 'Gas Row' Eye-Catcher At Restaurant Convention

Highlighting the recent Pacific Coast Regional Convention and Exposition of the Southern California Restaurant Association was a long line of new gas-fired commercial equipment, displayed at the Sports Arena in a series of eye-catching booths that became popularly known as "Gas Row."

More than 35,000 restaurateurs from the 14 Western states were on hand for the three-day affair.

In all, 500 exhibits covered the floor of the massive arena, displaying equipment valued at millions of dollars.

Restaurant owners and operators from throughout the Southland were invited by commercial sales representatives of the Southern California and Southern Counties Gas Companies.

G. M. Babbe, manager for the utility's Southwest division, commented on the enthusiasm of the show-goers.

"We were overwhelmed with the interest shown by food service industry people visiting our booths," Babbe said.

"The attention given to each and every piece of new equipment on Gas Row," Babbe added, "was an indication of new trends in all types of equipment used in the food service industry."

Governor Edmund G. "Pat" Brown officially welcomed industry representatives to the gathering.

The food service industry is the nation's third largest retail business, and the exposition held this year was the most extensive of its kind ever staged by the Southern California Restaurant Association.

The natural gas industry was represented by some 27 major manufacturers of gas equipment, displaying their products under the central theme, "Where Food is Finest, It's Cooked With Gas."

# B of A Sends Christmas Club Checks Monday

A brisk holiday shopping season in Torrance was indicated today by Bank of America's announcement that it is distributing 1961 Christmas Club checks totaling \$356,800 to local residents.

Harold G. Frentz, manager of the Torrance branch, and Vern Hughes, manager of the Sepulveda-Hawthorne branch, said 2900 Christmas Club checks will be mailed to local depositors this week.

Distribution of savings in this area is part of \$71.5 million being sent out by the bank this month to almost 500,000 Californians.

The average amount of each check is estimated at \$146.87, as compared to \$141.71 a year ago.

The total amount distributed and the number of participants equals 1960's record figures.

Christmas Club checks are mailed in November to help customers do their shopping early.

Not all of the checks go for yuletide gifts; some are used for end of the year expenses such as insurance and taxes, or to finance winter vacations.

# Controller Report Shows Funding of Special Districts.

Financial transactions of 3,123 special districts rendering service in 66 different categories are contained in the annual special districts report recently published by the State Controller's Office.

State Controller Alan Cranston said the report shows the districts had a total general fund income of \$335,740,295 for the 1959-60 fiscal year, and general fund expenditures of \$330,162,486.

Of the revenue collected, \$176,739,000 was from charges for services, \$121,160,000 from taxes and assessments, \$16,202,000 from subventions and grants, and the balance from other sources.

Fire protection districts—455 of them—represent the largest category, followed by: 426 for street lighting, 253 cemetery districts, 168 community water districts, 167 for lighting maintenance and 166 for soil conservation.

# Steel Shares Earn 98 Cents This Quarter

Armco Steel Corporation earned \$14,513,437, or 98 cents a share, in the third quarter of 1961, Logan T. Johnston, Armco president, has announced.

This compares with earnings of \$11,693,836, or 79 cents a share, in the third quarter of 1960.

Each quarter of the current year has shown an improvement in earnings from the preceding quarter, Johnston pointed out.

Earnings in the first quarter amounted to \$9,260,646, or 63 cents a share. Second quarter earnings totaled \$13,915,522, or 94 cents a share.

Earnings for the nine months period of the year amounted to \$37,689,605, or \$2.56 per share, compared with \$53,427,055, or \$3.61 per share, in the same period of 1960.
