## Angels, Colts 'On the Road' in Six Cities

In a throwback to the "old days" of baseball when clubs went on a barnstorming tour after they closed their spring training camps until the opening game of the season, the Los Angeles Angels and the Houston Colts 45 will "take the show on the road" to six cities after breaking camp on April 2.

General Manager Fred Haney of the Angels this week announced that his club, one of the American League's two newest teams, and the National League's new Houston club will play seven games, including a day-night doubleheader, on the way back East to the Angels season-opener at Chicago on April 10.

The Angels-Colt 45 tour, which will cover over 2000 miles, is the first time that

two Major League clubs have gone on "one-day" stands in a number of years. One of the most famous of all baseball barnstorming tours featured the Cleveland Indians and Giants when they were in New York.

The Angels already have announced their first game against the Los Angeles Dodgers to be played in Palm Springs on Monday, April 2. Immediately after that game, they fly to Albuquerque for a game on Tuesday, April 3. Afternoon encounters are on tap in El Paso, Texas, on April 4, San Antonio on April 5, a day-night doubleheader at Ft. Worth (day) and Dallas (night) on April 6 with a night game at Oklahoma City on April 7 and a tripartite Sunday afternoon game on April 8 in Oklahoma City.

## Underwater Film Festival Slated For January 6, 7

Unusual films of boating and fishing enthusiasts, "scuba" divers, in fact any kind of sea-going sports lover, will be screened Jan. 6 and 7 in Santa Monica Civic Auditorium at the 5th Annual Underwater Film Festival.

A wide variety of prize-winning underwater motion pictures and stills taken "many fathoms below" will be on display at the two-day exposition. Entries from France, England, Germany, Panama, Italy, Brazil and the U.S. will be screened. Sequences will range from

exciting closeups of a hand-to-hand fight between a diver and a giant Puget Sound octopus, to the discovery of an ancient oar-powered freighter in the Mediterranean. Details in the development of underwater cameras and lights will be shown, as well as new diving techniques which have helped man conquer the deep.

Five of the world's greatest undersea photographers will be honored at the Festival with the presentation of their newest and most exciting films. Among those represented will be Italy's

famed undersea adventurer, Victor De Santis, France's Captain Jacques Cousteau, pioneer skindiver and deep sea scientist-author, and Colonel John Craig of the U.S.

The Underwater Film Festival is a non-profit enterprise, with proceeds earmarked for continued research in underwater photography.
