

Walteria Businessman To Head Drycleaners

New gavel-holder for the International Drycleaners Congress of the Pacific will be Tom Jones, owner of Walteria Cleaners, who was elected at the organization's fourth convention early this month in Long Beach.

Jones was instrumental in creating the IDC early in 1959 when he, then a director of the California Drycleaners Association, discussed with George M. Shepherd, CBA executive secretary, the possibility of having a joint convention of the CDA and the Japanese Drycleaning Productivity Council.

Jones, along with Jack Wada of Los Angeles, contacted friends in the drycleaning business in Japan. One contact was the Takeo Igarashi Hakuyosha Co., Tokyo.

The more than 120 ships which are homeported in Long Beach each does its part in this drive, with some of the resultant contributions unbelievable.

The USS Pivot, an ocean minesweeper of the Pacific Mine Force, lead the drive with an amazing better-than-\$7 per man contribution. Pivot, whose hull number is 463, set that as a goal for the Drive and reached it with ease.

An outstanding example of team effort among the destroyer class ships homeported in Long Beach was the USS Benner with more than 11,200 collected with a permanent donation of \$5.23. Though other destroyers donated and nearly equalled Benner, it is sighted as an example of the magnificent support which the Relief Drive receives from its own men in the Navy.




Hahn pointed out that on May 24 he asked the County Regional Planning Commission when California would become the most populous state in the nation. The report, which incorporated both state and federal figures was received June 25. It's answer: "December, 1962."

County planners had hardly signed their report when the state revised its estimate, upping the proposed date to mid-November.

"Even as that estimate was still being recorded, the State reconsidered and said the big day would be nearer November 1," Hahn observed.

"The way things are going—and considering a big population boost in August and September with people moving here to register their children in school—I'm going to guess that California will be the most heavily populated state by October 1," Hahn said.

State head counters estimate California will top New York about the time both states have a population of 17.3 million.

"It looks like that will be sooner than we think," Hahn said.
