Community Effort Sought by Chief

With the approach of the opening of another school year, Chief Percy G. Bennett of the Torrance Police Department urged a concerted community effort to protect children from traffic hazards.

The responsibility, Chief Bennett said, rests with every resident of the community but a particular responsibility rests on the parents of young children, many of whom will be attending school for the first time.

Parents, the chief pointed out, should take time to teach their children the basic rules of safety and he listed these ten safety commandments:

Teach your child to look rules, signs, lights, officers and school safety patrols;

Teach your child to cross the street only at intersections;

Teach your child to look both ways before crossing the street;

Teach your child to watch for turning cars at intersections;

Teach your child to keep from between parked cars;

Teach your child to walk on the left facing traffic where no sidewalks are provided;

Teach your child to be extra alert on foggy or rainy days;


Teach your child, if he rides a bicycle, to single file and not to weave about in the street;

Teach your child to play only in the designated areas on the school lot and never in the street;

Teach your child that his or her safety is your greatest concern.

In addition to the 10 safety commandments, Chief Bennett warned parents who pick up their children at school to always park on the school side of the street and never to double park.
