Services will be held at the Mormon Chapel, 2000 W. 174th St., Torrance, on Rosh Hashonah, Friday, Sept. 28 through Sunday, Sept. 30 (on Sept. 30, services will be held at Temple Beth El, 1455 W. 7th, San Pedro) and on Jom Kippur, Sunday, Oct. 7 and Monday, Oct. 8.

Robbi Bernard Wechsberg, Ner Tamid's full-time spiritual leader, came to this city on April 1 from Chicago's Congregation Habonim and will conduct his first High Holiday Services with Ner Tamid.

Rabbi Wechsberg, who was born in Germany, received his education and rabbinical training at the Jewish Theological Seminary of Breslau and at the University of Breslau, and upon graduation was elected spiritual leader by the Jewish Community of Liegnitz, Germany, where he ministered until his immigration to the United States.

CAREER Rabbi Wechsberg's rabbi-

nical career in this country began in Los Angeles with the then Highland Park Temple. In 1940, he went to Denver, Colorado where he was associated with Denver's Beth Namedrosh Hagodol Synagogue. During this time, he acted as Chaplain in Army Camps throughout the State of Colorado.

In 1946, Rabbi Wechsberg was elected by Chicago's Congregation Habonim and served his congregation with distinction for the last fifteen years. He is a past-President of his area's (in Chicago) Council of Churches and Synagogues, served as an officer of the Chicago Board of Rabbis, and was most active in the Broad-
