Author Slates Lecture Here

British author Sir Arnold Lunn will tell about his fellow craftsmen when he appears on the Marymount College lecture series Thursday, Dec. 6, in the Student-Faculty Center.

He will relate anecdotes concerning G. B. Shaw, H. G. Wells, Ronald Knox, Chesterton, Belloc and Graham Greene, all of whom he has met in the course of pursuing his own literary career.

A graduate of Harrow and Balliol College, Oxford, he is the author of more than 30 books, among them "Is Christianity True?", "Difficulties," "Science and the Supernatural" and his autobiography, "Come What May."

The lecture begins at 8 p.m. with free admission.

Hot Shot Banjo Players at Santa Monica Concert

Three "hot shot" young banjo players and an expert on the giant tuba make up the Excelsior Banjo Band, a novel attraction featured on the Oscar Brand concert Nov. 30 at Santa Monica Civic Auditorium.

Banjos go way back to the early days of American music; banjos were featured instruments of the various minstrel troupes; Paul Whitman's hunch-caked banjoist was famous and Eddie Peabody, one of the finest U.S. banjoists of all time, is still very much around. Eddie's ability won him a commission in the Navy, and he's now a captain in the Naval Reserve.

The Excelsior Banjo Band consisting of Art Levin, the leader, Morrie Walker, Vic Wahlmeier and Spencer Quinn, have a repertoire of over 200 songs ranging from "Tiger Rag," a jazz classic to "I'm Looking Over a Four Leaf Clover." They not only play furiously and well, but illustrate their numbers with a projector and slides. Audience participation is an important part of their act. Oscar Brand is featured on the twin folk music shows and in addition to the Banjo Band, singers Hoyt Axton and Judy Henske are featured.
