T-Bird powered car owned by Bob Holbert of Ontario to victory in the last 40-lap race at Western two weeks ago, will be trying to better his sixth place ranking in CJA points by winning another main event this Sunday afternoon.

Out to stop him will be the two drivers that he beat out by a narrow margin at Western two Sundays ago, "Tiger" Jim Roessler of San Bernardino and Jack Austin of Downey.

Roessler will be after his sixth main event triumph of the year when he steps into his Corvette-powered racer for the day's 40-lap main event over the popular one-third mile oval.

Austin, in a Buick V8 powered machine, will be going after victory number four of the year at Western. Currently ranked third in the CJA point standing, he holds the six-lap track record of 1:35.77 for two miles.

Other main event victors who will be out to repeat in Sunday's 40-lap main event include Ed Van Eyk, "The Flying Dutchman" from Bellflower, with four wins; Jay West of Colton and Valle Engelauf of Riverside with three triumphs each; Chuck Townsen of Gardena, victor in two 40-lappers; and Art Atkinson of Pasadena, Freddie Thompson of Downey; and Bob Simmons of South Gate with a single victory each.
