Mass Chorus Featured at El Camino's 16th Concert

Over 100 voices in a mass chorus will be featured in the Sixteenth Annual Christmas Concert to be presented at 8:30 p.m. Dec. 15 and 3:30 p.m. Dec. 16 at the El Camino College Campus Theater.

Joining forces to present their talents will be the El Camino College Community Choir, under the direction of Crist Mikkelsen; the Concert Choir and Chorale, directed by Miss Jane Skinner and the Brass Choir, under the direction of Calvin Greer.

Two motets from "Sacrae Symphoniae" by G. Gabrieli will be the high point of the program. "This is the most exciting part of the program, involving more people and are consequently the hardest to coordinate," Mikkelsen, music instructor, stated.

Also featured in the concert will be several movements from Johann Sebastian Bach's work, "Magnificat." Featured are: Et Exultavit Spiritus Mens; (And My Spirit Hath Rejoiced); From Heaven Above to Earth I come; Et Misericordia (And His Mercy is on Them); Suscepit Israel, (His

Servant Israel), and Quia Resperit (For He Hath Regarded).

Parts of the opera, "Amahl and the Night Visitors," which was originally written for television in 1952, will be presented.

From the classical period, the "Kyrie Eleison" (Lord Have Mercy On Us) from the Lord Nelson Mass will also be performed and the modern Ava Maria (Hail Mary) by Igor Stravinsky.

"This year's concert has more sacred music than before. It is in a more serious vein than last year's concert," Mikkelsen said.

Soloists to perform during the production will be Amanda Scott, Lee Reavis, Robert Rodgers, Marian McGee, John Alegria, Mary Cobade, Jean Lang, Madison Taylor, Alden Willis, Sharon Thomas, Irving Byrne, Charlotte Tierman, Goldie Sugar, Claudia Wilkins, Floyd Wool, and Marilyn Miller.

Accompanying the choir will be Loretta Nisassio and Jeanne Fuller on the piano, and Jean Wells will be playing organ.

Admission is free and the public is invited to join with the students of El Camino in celebrating the holiday season.
