



Flood Control 'Priorities' Established by Supervisor

Since acquiring the Car-rance Municipal Water De-son area as part of his Sec-ond District, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn has reviewed the most vitally needed flood control and road projects and announced he will proceed "as quickly as possible" to have them completed.

High on the list of "priority jobs" is a section of Flood Control Project 540, which will serve the general area in the vicinity of Carson and Main streets.

The drain is planned to start at Main and 226th Pl., go north in Main to 223rd Street, east in 223rd to Avalon, north in Avalon to Carson, and east in Carson to Channel.

"I am asking the flood control district to have this project ready for bid within four months so construction may start in December," Hahn said.

The county engineer has completed the design on Project 540 and is reviewing it with various agencies which will be affected by construction.

Looking over plans so that construction projects in the area may be coordinated with the main job are:
