New Nursing Course Offers Career at Harbor General

High school graduates planning to enter Harbor College or El Camino College next term but undecided as to what course to pursue were advised yesterday to "take a long look" at the professional nursing program offered at each institution.

The advice came from four directors who met at Harbor General Hospital, 400 W. Carson St., to coordinate use of the hospital's clinical facilities with the "on campus" instruction.

The meeting was in the nursing division's conference room with Mrs. Bernadine Clark, RN, HGH director of nursing, presiding, and Miss Roberta Lindberg, RN, chairman, division of nursing, Harbor College, Mrs. Cynthia Barnes, RN, coordinator of nursing, El Camino College, and Miss Lucy Palermino, RN, education director, nursing, HGH, who will be immediate coordinator of the program.

The fall term will mark the first time Harbor College will be affiliated with Harbor General Hospital in the professional level whereas it will be the second semester for El Camino.

"Harbor College is looking forward to enrolling 60 student nurses who will be utilizing most modern facilities in less than one year old hospital," Miss Lindberg said.

"We are anticipating a class of 40 from El Camino," Mrs. Barnes declared, "and we already know that the HGH clinical facilities are highly regarded."

For the hospital, Mrs. Clark said: "Harbor General Hospital is a teaching hospital and we welcome addition of Har-

bor College students to the roles of those from El Camino. There is an urgent need for more nurses, not only here, but throughout the nation.

"Nursing is a satisfying profession and one in which employment is always obtainable. I think it would do the 'undecided' high school graduate considering a college program, to take a long look at what is being planned between the two colleges and this hospital."

The nursing program is of two calendar year duration and will include clinical experiences in other neighboring hospitals in medical, surgical, pediatric, psychiatric, and obstetric patient care.

Army Pvt. Bobby R. Crume, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ray G. Crume, 4545 Cadison St., has completed four weeks of extensive training with an armored vehicular-launched bridge in Germany.

During the training, Crume received instruction in the operation and capabilities of the movable bridge. Transported and launched by a converted tank, the bridge can be placed over a ravine, culvert or other difficult terrain.

Its ability to move into forward positions over rugged terrain makes this modern Army tool a formidable piece of equipment.

Crume, a cook in the 12th Engineer Battalion in Germany, entered the Army in November, 1962. He completed basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, Mo., and arrived overseas in April, 1963.

The 23-year-old soldier attended North High School and was employed by the Border Market before entering the Army.

ECC Slates Swim Class Registration

Registration for summer swimming classes offered by El Camino College will be conducted in the Campus Center July 27 at 8 a.m. Merj F. Sloan, director of student personnel, announced today.

Two two-week sessions beginning July 29 and Aug. 12 will be offered. Minimum age requirement for enrollment in the instructional program is seven years; children must be at least 50 inches in height. Classes are also offered for adults.

Classes begin at 8 a.m. each morning and run through 9 p.m. Facilities are available for the instruc-

tion of 1000 swimmers per day, many classes running concurrently in the two large enclosed pools on campus.

Schedules outlining hours of instruction for various age groups are available in the college, registration and physical education offices.

Included in the program are classes for water safety aides and junior and senior life saving.

All swimmers must furnish their own suits and towels; girls must also use bathing caps. A one dollar charge is made for each two-week session.
