Supervisor Hahn to Welcome Billy Graham

Billy Graham, who opens his Southern California Crusade August 15 in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, will receive an official welcoming scroll from Supervisor Kenneth Hahn on behalf of the county board of supervisors at 10 a.m. Aug. 12.

"In 1949, Billy Graham conducted his first city-wide crusade in tents at Washington Boulevard and Hill st. in Los Angeles," Hahn said.

Since then, he added, approximately 30,000,000 persons in six continents have heard the inspiring message of this young American Evangelist.

Hahn predicted that the 1963 Southern California Crusade will be one of the greatest in the history of Christendom.

Billy Graham and his

Evangelistic Team have taken their ministry to the battle fields of Korea during 1952, to London, England, to India, Asia and the Orient, to the Caribbean and Latin America, to Australia and New Zealand, and to Berlin's Olympic Stadium, 120 miles within the Soviet Zone.

"The board of supervisors scroll will be appreciation of Billy Graham's ministry and his dedicated and devoted service to mankind," Hahn said.
