**Is Your Business Conducted Under A FICTITIOUS FIRM NAME?**

If it is, then you should protect your firm name by publication of a legal ad once a week for four weeks. Section 2466 of the Civil Code states: "Every person and every partnership transacting business under a fictitious firm name must file a certificate stating the name in full and the place of residence of such persons and the membership of such partnership.

Unless a legal ad is published, your firm name is in jeopardy, and your business is not entitled to use the California courts for collection or other suits.
