# Protestants to Launch Annual Food Fund Drive

NEW YORK, N.Y., Nov. 14 — A decade of annual Thanksgiving appeals by Protestant denominations for funds to carry on their joint program of food distribution to the world's needy will be marked Sunday, Nov. 24, in churches throughout America.

Highlighting nationwide services dedicated to the appeal, which seeks \$950,000 for financing the SOS (Share Our Substance) program for 1964, through which more than 10 million of the world's hungry will receive life - sustaining U.S. food stocks, will be the National Service of Thanksgiving at the Washington Cathedral in Washington, D.C. at 3:30 p.m. Sunday (Nov. 24).

The service is sponsored annually by the Council of Churches of Greater Washington, and Church World Service, the overseas relief and rehabilitation agency of major Protestant denominations.

Bishop James K. Mathews of the Boston Area of the Methodist Church, who has just returned from a field trip to Africa, will be the principal speaker at the Washington Cathedral service. He will discuss problems of world hunger.

The Harvard - Radcliffe Glee Clubs will sing under the direction of Conductor Elliot Forbes.

Since its inception the SOS program has accounted for distribution of approximately two and a half billion pounds of U.S. Government-donated commodities to the hungry and destitute in more than 35 areas of acute need.
