## Jumping Jack Program Set for Vacation Week

A Christmas-holiday program geared at children of working mothers will be initiated this season by the Torrance YWCA.

Aimed at children in the 5-11 year age bracket, the Jumping Jack program will provide day-long activity throughout the school vacation period.

Purpose of the novelty activity is to provide a supervised program for youngsters who are ordinarily in school while their mothers are at their place of business.

Scheduled for Dec. 23 through Jan. 3, the program will run from 9 to 5 Monday through Friday. Where the mother's hours necessitate leaving the child slightly earlier, special arrangements will be made.

Cost will be \$8 per child per week, with a reduced fee of \$6 per week for the second child in the family.

A different program will be planned for each day. Activities will include supervised game period, movies, art, crafts, and short trips.
