United Crusade, Red Cross Map Plans for Joint Fund Campaign

Teamwork is already in action with the United Way and the Red Cross toward their newly formed fund raising partnership the United Crusade.

The same communities as are grouped into what is termed the Southern Region of the Los Angeles Red Cross Chapter and the Harbor Area United Way make up the United Crusade's Harbor area.

As one of the 13 geographical divisions of Los Angeles County, the Harbor Area, in-

cluding Gardena, Torrance, health, welfare and disaster services. . . .

WITH an expected goal of about 22 million, the Los Angeles County United Crusade will be the nation's largest united charitable appeal.

Since the United Way, which last year combined the efforts of 35 chests and funds in the County, and 13 chapters of the American National Red Cross have linked forces for a joint campaign, the agreement has been heralded as a significant new step in paring the number of annual bids for the public's attention, volunteer time and money.

Two Jaycee Members to Make List

They are Robert H. Vroman and George Brewster. Both were nominated by the chamber earlier this year and have been selected by a 13-man national board of editors for the publication.

Publication date is about Jan. 15, 1965. Men between the ages of 21 and 36 who "had distinguished themselves in one or more fields of endeavor to the point of being outstanding," were selected for the honor, Doug Blankenship, a past U.S. Jaycee president, said.

Outstanding Young Men of America is an annual biographical compilation of about 10,000 young men of outstanding rank throughout the country. Nominees for the book come from many sources, however, the majority of nominations are made by Junior Chamber of Commerce Chapters, Chamber of Commerce and college alumni associations.
