Mayor, 732 students, 33 more than expected. Second-largest school, was Seaside Elementary with 927 students, as anticipated.

ON THE HIGH school level, South High took the lead with 2,777 students. Enrollment at the other high schools was: North High, 2,577; Torrance High, 1,723; and West High, 1,479.

men Tuesday evening, said the ex-officers are not currently under the jurisdiction of the city. "Their resignations, properly or improperly obtained, terminated their official relationship with the city," Ferraro said. He added there is no provision in any city ordinance or in the charter "that provides for a review of their cases."

The opinion makes no mention of a time limitation, Ferraro added, and then asked if the two officers had recourse for an undeterminable period of time.

THE CITY manager charged McCabe with making a "shotgun" attack in the letter asking for reinstatement of Martin and Brady. Ferraro suggested the letter was "merely McCabe's argument and is extraneous to evidence of proof."

City Councilmen received Remelmeier's opinion on the case last week, but postponed discussion until Tuesday to give Ferraro a chance to study the opinion. McCabe, following last week's meeting, told the Press-Herald he would begin proceedings before the Civil Service Commission.

Enrollment in California junior colleges has increased 270 per cent since V-J Day. A 200 per cent rise is predicted between now and 1975. 1962-63 school year.


