The facts are that several bills were introduced at the 1963 session on obscene literature and were referred to the Committee on Criminal Procedure. This Committee, after several meetings, chose to refer the bills to an interim committee for investigation and study so that the Committee could at the 1965 session offer good, strong legislation covering every aspect in regard to all obscene literature.

As I am not a member of the Criminal Procedure Committee, and never have been, I could not have voted against the bills. I did, however, vote to uphold the rules of the Assembly that after the Criminal Procedure Committee had acted on the bills and sent them to an interim Committee for study, that no motion to withdraw a bill from a committee by a member for personal publicity reasons would be recognized.

Had the Committee in its wisdom voted to send one or all of the bills to the floor, I would have voted for them.





