woman with a bent toward novel approaches, Mrs. Schrank decided this fall that the era of the beautiful bulletin board had had its day. The time had come to make her environment shoulder its fair share of the teaching load. And that's exactly what she did.

What was formerly a wall of bulletin boards has become a work wall to develop study skills.

RUNNING THE entire length of the corkboard wall is the motto, "Our Committee Discover the World Around Us." Beneath the block letters keynoting the theme are four activity centers. Each center consists of a table and supplies.

Students working at the study center find their assignments tacked to the corkboard. They know that they are to do their "discovering of the world" through the media provided at their work center. Tools of exploration are newspapers, books, maps and globes.

While the committees carry on their research, the teacher works with the rest of the class.

What sort of assignments to the third-graders find waiting for them at the activity centers?

AT THE newspaper center, according to Mrs. Schrank, articles from current editions are tacked to the wall. Students are expected to read the article, check the dateline, and then locate the place where the event took place on the globe or map. In addition to learning to read maps, they are sharpening their spelling and vocabulary skills, she explained.

"When they are unable to locate a city on a globe," she said, "they look for it on a map." Eventually, they get the concept of the larger world, the smaller countries, and the close-to-home cities. By the end of the year she feels that they will have a broader concept of their place in the world at large than by having merely read about it in books.

COORDINATED with this are the assignments at the globe center. There the wall reads "What are my names, land colors, products and stories of history?" Tacked beneath the standing questions is the day's assignment. By electing a country on the globe and using books, the student is able to visualize the research he performs.

Assignments at the book center and map center are similar.

How has the experiment
