## Warriors Close Football Season

After nearing a major upset over No. 1 ranked Long Beach City College Saturday, the El Camino College Warriors close out their 1964 football campaign against Valley College, Saturday at 8 p.m. in Murdock Stadium.

The annual Homecoming parade in the stadium will begin at 7 p.m.

The main threat to the Warriors against Valley is that old feeling of letdown.

A 21-14 loss to Long Beach dropped El Camino to a 2-3 record in the Metro race. Over-all the Warriors are 5-3.

Stalwarts Pat Pagett, Phil Pomeroy, Bob Johnson, Steve Bucher, Rick Cooper, Ed Estrada, Terry Hansen, Lindsay Hughes, Dennis Loehr, Larry Pettrill, Joe Reid, Otto Rieger and Don Smith will be among Warriors playing their final game for the Warriors.

Pagett and Johnson will share the quarterback spot, while Pomeroy will carry the rushing load. Against Long Beach, Johnson hit on 12 of 17 aeriels for 116 yards and one touchdown, while Pagett connected on 4 of 6 for 40 yards.

Pomeroy was the leading ground gainer with 65 yards on 14 romps for a 4.6 average. He also scored the Warriors' first TD on a 10-yard scamper.
