Education Assistance Act Explained by VA Director

Injuries or illness that disabled veterans or bring about their death do not have to be wartime in origin to make their children eligible for the educational assistance administered by the Veterans Administration, Mort Webster, manager of VA's Southern California regional office, has announced.

The original War Orphans Education Assistance program was set up solely for those children whose veteran-parent had died due to wartime injuries or illness in peacetime service. Congress later amended this to include also children of veterans whose deaths had resulted from extra-hazardous line-of-duty injuries or illness in peacetime service.
