 NOTICE OF HEARING ON PROPOSED ANNEXATION OF TERRITORY TO THE DOLORES LIGHTING DISTRICT AND TO ESTABLISH SAID TERRITORY AS TEMPORARY ZONE 31

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 24th day of November, 1964, a petition was filed with the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, proposing that the territory hereinafter described be annexed to the Dolores Lighting District, pursuant to the provisions of the Highway Lighting Act (Division 14, Part 4 of the Streets and Highways Code of the State of California). The subject of the petition is as follows:

DOLORES LIGHTING DISTRICT
 TO BE KNOWN AS TEMPORARY ZONE 31
 Honorable Board of Supervisors

 Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned, respectfully request that the area designated by the accompanying map and described as being annexed to the Dolores Lighting District, and that street lights be installed utilizing steel standards with overhead wiring EXCEPT AT LOCATIONS WHERE THERE ARE EXISTING WOOD POLES WHICH MAY BE USED FOR STREET LIGHTS, and maintained; and declare:

That we are the owners of real property within that certain territory hereinafter described, representing at least twenty-five per cent of the assessed valuation of the real property in said territory; and that the total number of the owners of real property in said territory is 25 and the assessed valuation of said property as shown by the last equalized assessment roll of Los Angeles County is \$184,000 and that the territory is in Los Angeles County, but is not within the limits of any existing district; and

We further request: (1) that if the territory herein described or any part thereof is annexed to the Dolores Lighting District, and assessed territory, be established as a temporary zone for the purpose of levying a special tax therein to finance the cost of installing street lights on steel standards; (2) that the temporary zone be formed immediately upon the annexation of said territory to the district and that said zone remain in existence until expiration of the first two complete fiscal years in which it is possible to levy a special tax within the zone for the purposes mentioned.

We understand that the approximate cost to the annexed territory during the time it is a temporary zone is as shown on the face sheet of this petition.

We declare: that we are the owners of real property within that certain territory hereinafter described, representing at least 60% of the assessed valuation of said property as shown by last equalized assessment roll of Los Angeles County; that the territory is contiguous to the Dolores Lighting District, territory of Los Angeles County and is not within the limits of any existing district.

The boundaries of said territory are described as follows:
 Beginning at the intersection of a line that is parallel with and 125 feet westerly, measured at right angles, from the center line of 22nd Street as said center line is shown on map of Tract No. 27074 recorded in Book 198, pages 8 and 9 of the records in the office of the Recorder of the County of Los Angeles, with the westerly prolongation of the northerly line of Lot 1 of said tract; thence easterly in a direct line to the northeast corner of Lot 10 of said tract; thence southerly in a direct line to the southeast corner of said tract; thence westerly in a direct line through the southwest corner of Lot 9 to the point of beginning.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the said Board of Supervisors has fixed the 17th day of December, 1964, at 2:30 o'clock a.m. thereof, in the Hearing Room of the Board of Supervisors, 500 West Temple Street, Los Angeles, California, as the time and place for the hearing upon the said petition, and any person who may be aggrieved by or against the annexation of any territory to the said District, and that all persons desiring to be heard thereon may then appear and be heard.

 NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN in the matter of County Improvement No. 2249-M (Ortiz Avenue) that sealed bids or proposals will be received up to 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, the 8th day of January, 1965, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, at its office at 585 Hall of Administration, 500 West Temple Street, Los Angeles, California 90012, for the purchase of bonds to be issued in accordance with the provisions of Division 12 of the Streets and Highways Code (Municipal Improvement Act of 1913) and Division 7 of the Streets and Highways Code, for the acquisition of rights of way and for the construction of curb, gutter, walk, driveways and pavement under the provisions of the Municipal Improvement Act of 1913.

Said bonds shall be issued for all unpaid assessments or portions thereof which amount to fifty dollars (\$50.00) or over, and shall be in the respective amounts as set forth in the assessment for County Improvement No. 2249-M. Said bonds will be dated the 15th day of November, 1964, and shall bear interest at a rate to be determined at the sale thereof, provided, however, that said rate shall be the maximum rate of six per cent (6%) per annum and shall be multiples of one-fourth (1/4) of one (1) per cent.

Said bonds and the coupons thereon shall be issued substantially in the form authorized for the issuance of bonds under Division 7 of the State of California, Highway Code of the State of California, and shall be serial bonds and shall mature over a period ending nine (9) years from the second day of the next succeeding DELTA September 1st following their date, the principal sum thereof to be payable, by coupon, on the second day of January every year after the next September 1st following their date, until the whole is paid, and the interest shall be payable second days of January and July, respectively, of each year following the date of the bonds.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF BONDS TO BE SOLD IN THIS MATTER IS THREE (3) IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF THIRTY-TWO (32) HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN DOLLARS AND EIGHT CENTS (\$32.13). Said bonds will be sold for cash only to the highest bidder in the opinion of the Board of Supervisors who will best serve the interest of owners of land included in the assessment district.

Each bid must state that the bidder offers accrued interest to the date of delivery, and state separately the premium, any and the rate of interest offered for the bonds bid for. Each bid shall be for the entire amount of said bonds at a single rate of interest and of interest will be returned for less than par and accrued interest to the date of delivery must provide for an interest rate on the bonds of not less than the maximum rate of six (6) per cent per annum.

Payment and delivery of bonds will be made in the office of the County Treasurer.

A certified or cashier's check for a sum not less than three per cent (3%) of the amount of the bonds, payable to the order of the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors must accompany every bid as a guaranty, will accept and pay for the bonds described in the accepted bid in accordance with the terms of his bid. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall transmit said check to the County Treasurer, and said check shall remain in the possession of the County Treasurer until payment for said bonds has been received. The Board reserves the right to reject any or all bids. The Board also reserves the right to disregard irregularities and technical defects in bids.
