

Interstate Calls Get Lower Rate

Reduced rates in long-distance station-to-station telephoning continues. pattern of long-distance telephoning continues.

Principal changes which will become effective Feb. 1 are:

- The \$1 minimum rate now in effect after 9 p.m. for a 3-minute station-to-station call in the continental United States will apply all day Sunday and on weekday evenings starting at 8 p.m.
- Rates will be reduced for many station-to-station interstate calls between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. weekdays and all day Saturday.
- Station-to-station rates will be reduced between the U.S. mainland and Hawaii with the lowest rates applicable all day Sunday and after 8 p.m. weekdays.
- The reductions do not apply to long-distance phone rates within California.

"FURTHER RATE cuts applying solely to business use of long-distance telephone service and tailored to bring the greatest reduction to small business and professional men will go into effect later next year," stated Leggett.

New Cross-Country Phone Cable Goes Into Service

A new coast-to-coast telecommunication centers automatically cuts in the protection coaxial and service continues without interruption.

The new cable system passes through 19 states: New York, New Jersey, Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, Ohio, Kentucky, Indiana, Illinois, Missouri, Kansas, Colorado, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, and California.

The system, built at a cost of \$200 million, can withstand hurricanes, cyclones, tornadoes and nuclear blasts short of a direct hit, Leggett said.

The cable, extending for nearly 4,000 miles from New York to California, adds 9,000 telephone circuits, or voice channels, to the 15,000 now spanning the country.

THE FIRST of its kind in the world, the new communications route was engineered by the Long Lines Department of the American Telephone and Telegraph Co.

The system has now been under construction for five years, Leggett stated.

The Western Electric Co., manufacturing arm of the Bell System, provided the cable and installed transmission equipment in the communications centers and amplifier stations along the route.

THE SECTION running through California and Nevada was constructed by the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co.

Strung along the transcontinental route of the new cable are 900 underground intermediate amplifier stations—all unmanned—and 11 manned communication centers that link the cable with existing facilities.

The communications centers, built of heavily reinforced concrete, are one to two story buildings, entirely underground. Small entrance buildings are the only structures above ground.

In emergencies, each center can generate its own power and provide living quarters, food and water to operate in a "buttoned-up" condition for at least three weeks.

THE CABLE itself is buried from four to five feet underground. It is built to withstand an overall pressure of more than 100 pounds per square inch.

By comparison, Leggett noted, an overall pressure of one-half pound per square inch could crush an average house.

The system, which bypasses all major cities and potential nuclear target areas across the nation, provides circuits for telephone service, private line services, telephone typewriter exchange service, and government communications.

Coaxial cables, introduced for long distance communications in 1936, are used to transmit telephone conversations, data and other specialized services, Leggett said.

COMMUNICATIONS are carried inside the cable by pencil-sized, copper tubes called coaxials. In the New York-Washington section of the new route there are two cables, each containing eight coaxials. Westward, there is a single cable with 12 coaxials. Approximately 1,860 simultaneous conversations can be transmitted over a pair of coaxials.

Two coaxials in the system are reserved for protection purposes. If a working coaxial fails, equipment at the
