Senator Barry M. Goldwater's vote victory in the Torrance area was celebrated by more than 150 local Goldwater volunteer workers with a dinner held at the Palms restaurant, Torrance, turned in 24,491 votes for Senator Goldwater as against 23,179 for President Johnson.
