

County Now Testing New Ford Anti-Smog Device

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn has revealed that the County is testing a 1965 Ford with special smog control equipment which represents a "major breakthrough for the motoring public" in the air pollution battle. The car was provided by Ford for tests because the firm is seeking a contract for 165 Sheriff's cars. The Board of Supervisors has decided that only cars which meet all smog control standards will be purchased. "This proves the automobile industry, if properly motivated, has the ability to install effective smog control devices on its products on the assembly line," Hahn said. "When a major sale is involved, they do the job," he added. THE SUPERVISOR said the Ford device provides better control of gas combustion through an improved distributor and carburetor. "It costs only about \$10 and the industry could assume that for new cars without charging the purchaser extra," he said. In 1955 Hahn met with Ford officials in Detroit and drove a test model car on the proving grounds. It, too, had special devices to control smog. "With some stepped-up research the industry could have installed that device on all new cars years ago, and we could be well on the way to solving the smog problem by now," Hahn said. SINCE 1953 Hahn has annually written the heads of the three major automotive manufacturers urging that they assume their rightful responsibility in installing smog control devices before the car leaves the assembly line. "This breakthrough indicates the motoring public may not have to purchase an expensive \$50 to \$75 muffler device and spend from \$2 to \$30 a year to maintain it," Hahn said. HAHN REPORTED that the Ford model has adequately met the standards, which is a maximum of 300 parts per million of hydrocarbons and a maximum of 1.5 parts per million of carbon monoxide. This vehicle has been shown to emit only 179 parts per million of hydrocarbon and .81 per million of carbon monoxide. "If Ford can install this equipment on 165 cars to get a County contract, there's no reason it can't be installed on all new cars," Hahn stressed.
