chester Enterprises, Inc., owners of the property, will be required to submit precise plans for any development of the land.

- Adopted a resolution calling on the county to appropriate \$150,000 for the improvement of Del Amo Boulevard between Anza and Hawthorne avenues.
- Approved final plans and specifications for additions to the city's police station and authorized the city manager's office to advertise for bids on the project.
- Waived fees normally required for the installation of signs at the Torrance YWCA.
- Approved an administrative budget of \$14,000 for the Redevelopment Agency. The city will be reimbursed for the money if the urban renewal application is approved by the federal government.
- Appropriated \$5,000 for the completion of the final phase of the civic auditorium study being conducted by Economic Research Associates.
- Allocated \$1,570 to support the sister city program with Guatemala City for the remainder of the fiscal year.
- Adopted on final reading ordinances establishing a seven-member Civil Service Commission and providing for the regulation of carnivals or other similar shows.

to Washington. He expects final approval of the application in six or eight weeks. The money will be used for a survey of the redevelopment area, located between Pacific Coast Highway and Lomita Boulevard at the west end of the Torrance Municipal Airport. Appraisals of property in the area will be made during the survey.

Scharfman said no part of the \$255,000 would be used for property acquisition.
