(Continued from Page 1) ter) pretty strong," Charles told Dr. Hull.

Ferraro told the Press-Herald yesterday that the proposed sewer maintenance district has been approved "in principle" by the city council during budget sessions last June. He said the fees would permit the city to maintain the sewers—specifically to add another maintenance crew—and pay for the service on the basis of use. The cost of an additional crew would be \$20,000 to \$30,000 for the first year, Ferraro said.

Specific plans for the district have not been submitted to the council, and the letter was written to the school district "as a courtesy," Ferraro said.

Car Sale Law Wins Approval

Confusion was plentiful around city hall during the City Council's regular session last night.

The confusion, and the eventual adoption of a new ordinance, had to do with efforts of the council to prohibit the use of vacant lots along major highways as used car lots. Technical flaws which Councilman David K. Lyman pointed out last week in the first ordinance necessitated a new start.

The new ordinance, drawn by City Attorney Stanley Remelmeier, makes it unlawful to "offer for sale, or to permit sales of any vehicle" on premises not improved to city standards for a parking lot without a valid business license.

There are two exceptions: Persons may offer two vehicles a year for sale on premises which they occupy, and, "For sale" signs may be displayed in a vehicle while it is "in transit" or while parked with permission of the property owner for purposes of business other than the sale of the vehicle.

"We are thinking of two or three lots on Hawthorne Avenue, and we've created this monster," Lyman said. Councilmen first attempted to repeal the provision providing for the display of

"for sale" signs largely because they had misread the ordinance. They then voted down the suggestion by Mayor Albert Isen to strike everything and require only written permission of the property owner.

The original ordinance was finally adopted on a 5-2 vote, with Lyman and George Vico opposing it. It will become effective in about 30 days.
