Security Rates '64 Top Year

A report that 1964 was the most profitable year in the history of Security First National Bank has been issued by Lloyd L. Austin, chairman of the board. Net operating earnings for last year were 11 per cent above those of 1963 and total resources, loans, deposits and capital funds reached all-time highs.

Net operating income for 1964 totaled \$31,632,665, compared with \$28,592,667 in 1963. This was equivalent to \$4.16 per share on 7,600,000 shares outstanding, against \$3.76 a year ago.

Other year-end improvements were:

- Total resources, 1964, \$4,635,410,591, and \$4,503,356,964 in 1963.
- Loans, less reserves, 1964, \$2,415,340,880, and \$2,097,168,706 in 1963.
- Total deposits, 1964, \$4,236,483, and \$4,129,621,207 in 1963.

- Total securities, 1964, \$1,314,979,709 and \$1,515,595,527 in 1963.
- Gross operating income, 1964, \$229,153,575, and \$212,306,599 in 1963.
