Another pink hybrid tea that's on everybody's "who's who" of favorite roses is the classic Tiffany, as elegant as its name. Long pointed buds with yellow shading at the base open to beautiful phlox pink flowers. Noted for fragrance, length of stem and bud.

CHRISTIAN DIOR is still very much a name to reckon with, and this magnificent hybrid tea reflects the elegance and perfection of the late world-renowned "Prince of Fashion." Magnificent crimson-red overlaid with iridescent scarlet, it is exquisitely formed with large double blooms. It remains colorfast throughout its long life.
It seems fitting to end this rose parade with one more of the grandifloras—those excellent shrubby roses that are finding so many landscape uses in the California garden. John S. Armstrong is a good example of what a dark red one should be. Its magnificent deep coloring is unequalled in richness, and the profuse buds and blooms are colorfast in every stage. Flowers, borne in clusters with long individual stems, last more than a week when cut.

All of these magnificent winners are at your C.A.N. nursery now, freshly dug and ready to plant bare-root. Chose among these vigorous plants and put them in this month. Winter planting will give their roots plenty of time to become established before the roses start putting on their vivid seasonal show.

The 25-year-old soldier, an operations assistant in company A at the range, entered the Army in July 1963. He completed basic training at Ft. Ord, Calif.




