Superintendents Explore Area Vocational Center

Is there a need in the Torrance area for a vocational and trade center which might serve several school districts? The question was tossed to superintendents of six area school districts at a brainstorming session held on Wednesday at the Indian Village Restaurant.

Los Angeles City Schools' spokesman, J. Lyman Goldsmith, pointed out that setting up a skills center would be expensive, but that federal and state funds were available. He indicated that it might be possible to provide for job entry skills within the framework of the composite high school and adult school program.

"The State has \$13,500,000 this year to allocate; our requests have been for double that amount. I recommend that we spend this money in exploring and developing new areas. Despite my initial scepticism, this vocational center is one of those new areas I'd like to see evolve."

Purpose of the meeting was to exchange views regarding the possibility of some sort of joint venture which would prepare high school students with specific marketable skills to fill current needs of local industry. More than 40 persons attended.

NEED FOR selective screening of students who would attend a skills center was the advice of Lee Ralston, Los Angeles County Superintendent's office, division of practical arts.

Labor representative Robert White of the Los Angeles County Federation of Labor said that labor is looking for better ways to do things. "We want the greatest good for the greatest number at the least cost to the taxpayer," he stated.

DISTRICTS represented at the meeting included: El Segundo Unified School District, Inglewood Unified School District, Centinela Valley Union High School District, Palos Verdes Peninsula Unified School District, South Bay Union High School District and Torrance Unified School District.

Records of the California Department of Employment indicate that more than 400 youngsters who left high schools in this city during the last three years are unemployable because of lack of skills, said Mrs. June Roper of the department's Torrance office.

IN ANSWER to Dr. Hull's question "Does labor feel we should continue general education for high school students or should we give high school students a marketable skill?" White said the apprentice trades should be considered separately from basic skills.

Participating in the verbal exchange were representatives of labor, industry, the State Department of Education, the Los Angeles County Superintendent's office, the office of the County Counsel, the California Department of Employment and the Torrance Chamber of Commerce.

Industry's willingness to help set up a guide for a skills center was expressed by Frank Rizzardi, administrator of the fellowship and educational program at North American Aviation, Inc.

A "skills center" would differ from a comprehensive high school, Dr. Hull told the group, in that it would not be set up on a semester and credit basis.

After superintendents of the districts involved report to their boards a follow-up meeting will be scheduled. No date has been set, and no conclusions reached.
