

**IN THE ROUND . . .** A custom-built rotary-type dispatch completion desk installed in General Telephone Co.'s Southwest division service office makes for speedier, more efficient handling of service and repair orders. The meal valuations for 1965 are the same as for 1963 and 1964 with three meals a day valued at \$1.45. Individual meal breakdown is:

**Guardsmen Demonstrate Units to Purify Water**

Members of the 132nd Engineer Battalion, 40th Armored Division, California Army National Guard, demonstrated this week five mobile water purification units which, in an emergency, can supply water for 60,000 troops.

Purification units are manned by the battalion in Torrance, Manhattan Beach, Burbank, Ontario and Lynwood.

**Landscaping Of Torrance In 'Sunset'**

The community beautification project of Torrance as a part of Southern California's "Celebrate with Color" program is featured in the February issue of Sunset magazine.

"Celebrate with Color" is the five-year program to plant trees, shrubs, vines and ground covers throughout Southern California to beautify the state in celebration of its 200th birthday in 1969. Brazilian pepper trees, which are planted throughout Torrance, are noted in the article as good examples of what proper planning and planting can accomplish.

A list of 91 trees suitable to Southern California is included in the article.

Sixteen guardsmen are being trained to operate the units in Ft. Leonard Wood, Mo., as part of their six month active duty training.

During the exercise guardsmen demonstrated the cycle of purifying water to a drinkable state. Each unit, which is self-contained and mobile, costs \$28,000 and has the capacity to purify water at the rate of 1,500 gallons per hour. Guardsmen, when trained, will work in teams of three men per unit. The units will be permanently based at the Battalion headquarters in Manhattan Beach.

**Hi-Shear Marks Gain For Year**


