

# Wide Variety of Classes Offered by Adult School

Sixty-five courses will be offered in adult education classes of the Torrance Unified School District this fall. Sessions will begin Monday, Sept. 20.

Registration for new students seeking a diploma will take place by appointment at The Adult Education Office, 2200 W. Carson St., beginning Sept. 1. Appointments may be made by calling FA 8-8080. Ext. 295 afternoons or FA 8-9206 evenings.

Non-credit students may register with the classroom teacher the first night of class. Programs of course offerings will be available at the adult education center and library branches after Sept. 1.

INCLUDED in the program are several new listings.

Offered for the first time in cooperation with the Los Angeles County Health Department Division of Dairies and Dairy Products and the California Dairy Industries Association will be two 10-hour courses for milk plant handling personnel: Health and Sanitation Practices, set for Sept. 28 through Oct. 26, and Laboratory Procedures and Practices, Nov. 2 through 30, at Torrance High School.

Taught in cooperation with the Federal Internal Revenue Department will be a course in Federal Income Tax Preparation. Twelve-hour sessions are set for Sept. 21 through Oct. 26 and Jan. 19 through Feb. 23 at Torrance High School.

OTHER SPECIAL or new classes include: Investments and Securities, a 10-week course dealing with principles of investment in the stock market; Conversational Italian; and Literature and Composition.

First aid will be taught in cooperation with the American Red Cross in a series of four 12-hour courses beginning Sept. 23 at Torrance High School.

Rounding out the special offerings will be Traffic Safety Education, a consecutive series of 12 clock-hour courses, offered in cooperation with the Los Angeles County Superior Court, to re-acquaint juvenile traffic offenders with state laws and regulations governing safe use of motor vehicles.

REGULAR CLASSES will take place at Torrance High School, North High School, and South High School. Parent education courses will be at Waleria Park and McMasters Park. Knitting will be taught at Waleria Park, and Psychology and Personal-

keeping, advanced bookkeeping, beginners' carpenter apprenticeship, advanced carpenter apprenticeship, classroom chemistry, chemistry laboratory, citizenship for the foreign born, beginners' drawing and painting, dressmaking, economics, English of Foreign Speaking, English Review I and II, English III,

English Literature and Composition, conversational German, machine shop, general mathematics, music appreciation and choral, public speaking, classroom and darkroom photography, physical fitness for men, psychology, modern science, basic sewing, beginners' shorthand, brush up shorthand and dictation, beginners' typing, advanced typing, U.S. Government I, U.S. Government II, U.S. History I, U.S. History II, and wood shop.
