Ping Pong Organized For Girls

Table tennis program for girls 12 to 13 years old begins tomorrow at 7:30 p.m. at El Retiro Park Rotary Youth Building, 126 Vista del Parque, Redondo Beach.

An exhibition and demonstration arranged through the United States Table Tennis Association will get the ball bouncing.

Objectives of the program are to organize a self-governing club of teenage girls for the playing and training of table tennis, to encourage girls in sports in general, and to start a pilot program from which a city-wide ping pong league may be launched with inter-club play and rivalry.

The girls table tennis program is sponsored by the Hollywood Riviera Sportsman's Club in cooperation with the Torrance Recreation Department.

The Riviera Sportsman's Club handicap system will be used to challenge even the veteran player and encourage the novice. This handicap system will be used, as in golf and bowling, to insure that less experienced players can compete on an equal basis with more experienced players.

Tennis shoes or rubber-soled shoes are required to participate in the program.

Parnelli Jones Enters Race

Parnelli Jones, 1964 winner of the L. A. Times Grand Prix at Riverside, is the newest entrant in the Stardust Grand Prix to be held at the Stardust International Raceway in Las Vegas next week.

Jones joins 1965 L. A. Times Grand Prix winner Hap Sharp, Jim Hall, and Walt Hansen for the race, which is expected to attract the nation's greatest drivers.

Both Jones and Hansen will be driving Lola Type 70 sports cars built in England. The engines will be the American 289 powerplants prepared by Shelby American.

Jones and Hansen may have an advantage over their competitors since both have already been over the 3.0-mile course. The circuit was

officially opened in late September, and Jones and Hansen were two of the five racers who did test drives around the course. The others were Harp Sharp, Pedro Rodriguez and Ken Miles.

The three-day program of competition starts Friday, Nov. 12, when the first 20 grid positions will be filled in races starting at 3:30 p.m. Ten cars will be added from the preliminary race. The Grand Prix will take place Sunday, Nov. 14, at 2 p.m.

Players Provide Ram Pep Talks

The dressing room was a tire 1964 season. This is the place of deepest gloom. The Rams had just dropped a disheartening 31-7 decision to Detroit Lions during which costly fumbles cut short one drive after another.

But center Ken Iman is not a man to dwell on the adversities of life. He spoke out earnestly: "We've got seven more games, starting with the Vikings next Sunday. We can still win 'em. We're not giving up yet!"

That is the sort of attitude that has made Iman, still a relatively "green" player by National Football League standards, one of the key men in the Rams' game plans each week.

Says offensive line coach Bill Austin, who first worked with Iman while both were with the Green Bay Packers: "He's a real fireball . . . he never quits. He has confidence every time the team comes on the field that they're going to win the game, and he tries to keep his teammates in the same frame of mind."

Austin continues his analysis: "Ken is very good at picking up a blitz on pass protection. He's one of the quickest men on the squad and he uses his agility to good advantage. Of course he has a lot of football to learn yet. This is actually his first year as a starter."

Iman came to the Rams in 1964 as a center after four seasons with the Packers. Yet he had never started a game as a Packer center, because he had the misfortune to be playing behind All Pro center Jim Ringo.

The Packers usually used Ken as a linebacker.

He broke his ankle before his first league game with the Rams and sat out the en-
