

West Opposes Eagles In Pioneer Contest

"We know we've got to play a football game."

That's the way Coach Fred Peterson describes the attitude of his West High football team as the team prepares for Friday's encounter with El Segundo. West will travel to El Segundo for the Pioneer League game.

In other Pioneer League action, league leading Palos Verdes will travel to Hawthorne High field for a game with winless Lennox and Aviation (1-2) hosts Lawndale (2-1). All games are scheduled to start at 8 p.m.

At stake for West is a two-game Pioneer League win streak, as well as a shot at a share of the league title should Palos Verdes come up on the short end of a score in the two remaining games.

El Segundo, led by QB Jerry Filson, threw the biggest scare of the season at Palos Verdes last week be-

fore succumbing to at 25-13 loss.

West won a 13-7 victory over Aviation last week, leaving the Warriors 2-1 in the league and 6-1 on the season. El Segundo's only league victory is a 21-0 win against Lennox, but the Eagles have won 5 of 7 games on the season.

Bobby Unser of Albuquerque, N.M., the famed Pikes Peak hill climber and three-

time Indy starter, has been in third place for several weeks after winning three of four races before the drivers transferred their speed war to the Southland.

Despite the battle for the national championship, local interest Saturday night centers around the "Flying Texan" A. J. Foyt, one of the all-time greats of automobile racing, and a four-time national and two-time Indianapolis champion.

Mario Andretti, 1965 national driving champion and Indy rookie of the year, is another who'll draw attention from the likely overflow Ascot crowd.
