

# Airliner Passenger Lists Keep Growing

Fewer people than ever can say, "I've never been up in a plane." The air age keeps on winning new converts to traveling through the wild blue yonder.

More than 38 per cent of the people in the United States have now flown on a commercial liner, according to a recent survey. Just three years ago this figure was only 33 per cent. As might be expected, a larger proportion of men have used commercial flights, but both men and women air passengers have increased in number.

Citizens who are 50 or older are apparently showing less trepidation about flying. Of this group, 33 per cent have flown commercially, the study indicates, a 10 per cent increase since 1962. The 21-to-34-year group includes the largest number of flyers — 46 per cent have used commercial airliners.

**KEY CHAIN**—In the new front wheel drive car just introduced by Oldsmobile the power train, which transfers torque from the engine to the front wheels, includes a unique chain assembly that uses a tough, silent chain developed by Borg-Warner's Morse Chain Co. in cooperation with General Motors. "This chain, by solving the problems of wear, noise and cost, should encourage other car manufacturers to consider front wheel drive," said Robert O. Bass, president of Morse.

The front drive lets designers eliminate the conventional drive shaft tunnel, giving the Toronado a completely flat floor, and more room for six passengers. A low roofline is also possible without sacrificing head room.

Engineers worked for months to develop a chain assembly quieter and less expensive than the gear sets used in European front-wheel-drive designs. "Since American motorists have long been accustomed to quiet running cars, it was essential that we develop a silent chain assembly," said Bass. "We designed a rolling action into the chain that virtually eliminates friction," he continued, "and this means greater horsepower capacity, longer wear life, faster speeds and cooler and quieter operation."

**THINGS TO COME** — Portable accent lights for outdoor use in all weather are useful for Christmas lighting, for illuminating steps and driveways and for discouraging thieves. Set includes automatic timer, weatherproof cable, and six sealed-beam lamps. . . Home fire alarm, without cords or wires, and about the size of a wall thermostat, as extremely long shelf life. 
