Before returning to the Los Angeles schools, she taught for one year in San Bernardino. Mrs. Naslund began her Los Angeles teaching career at Hawaiian Ave. and Seventh St. schools in Wilmington. She served in this area as middle grade supervisor and as principal of 186th Street and Windsor Hills Schools.

The area educator has been a university instructor at USC; supervisor of teacher training for the Los Angeles Schools; and is currently the principal of Delgado Road School in Westwood.

Engagement Revealed At Family Party



Arrangements for the program were made by Mrs. Michael Lotocky, program chairman of the Torrance Y-Wives.



Vecinas Volunteers On Duty at Hospital

A program is prescribed for each patient and the volunteers follow these orders with cheerfulness and encouragement.
