Dr. Peterson Plans Approved for Storm Of STL Dies, Drain Rites Today

Funeral services for Dr. John W. Peterson, assistant director of product engineering and microtechniques laboratory for Spzce Technology Laboratories of Redondo Beach, were held at 2 p.m. today in St. Francis Episcopal Church, Palos Verdes Estates. Dr. Peterson, 45, died at his home at 5506 Paseo de Pablo, Torrance, Sunday evening.

Affiliated with TRW for the past 10 years, Dr. Peterson had been vice president of TRW Semiconductors, Inc., and a director of research and development for the same firm before moving up to his latest assignment.

Dr. Peterson is survived by his widow, Beverly, and five children.

Planning for a mile and a half of storm drain facilities in the City of Lomita was begun this week by John Lambie, county engineer. Lambie estimated costs of the storm drain project at \$1,273,000. The project, which has been given a top priority by the county, involves the construction of drains on 250th Street between Walnut Street and Crenshaw Boulevard and on Walnut Street between 250th and 247th streets. A section also will be built on 247th Street from Walnut Street to Western Avenue.

Funds for the project are contained in the storm drain bond issue approved by county voters last November. Lambie also said three projects under the 1958 bond issue have been authorized. They include drains on Narbonne Avenue from 255th to 246th streets, on Walnut Street from Pacific Coast Highway north to 253rd Street, and on Ebony Lane from 253rd Street to 248th Street.
