




Explorers Hold Lomita Scout Day

Population Will Hit 400 Million in 2000

The man or woman who will be inaugurated President of the United States on Jan. 20, 2001, is among us now or will be born this year.

The President elected in the year 2000 will have to be at least 35 years of age if the present constitutional age requirement is maintained. If the new president is the average age of presidents at inauguration—that is 54—he or she has already graduated from high school or will finish this summer.

If the future president is as old as the oldest president at inauguration (William Henry Harrison was 68) he is now 33; and, if he is as young as the youngest (Theodore Roosevelt, 42) he is or shortly will be seven.

One thing is certain, however. The President elected in 2000 will have a much larger consistency than Lyndon Johnson. Population experts predict almost 400 million United States citizens in the year 2000—and that is almost double today's figure. The future President will talk about taxes, too. The

cost of untangling traffic jams that 350 or 400 million people can cause, the cost of educating the 350 or 400 million, and the cost of recreation for those same 350 to 400 million souls.

Mouth-to-mouth resuscitation was demonstrated by Capt. Walter West of the Torrance Fire Department to parent members of the Torrance Cooperative Nursery School. A Swedish-made mannequin named "Annie," equipped with a set of lungs, was used by Dr. West in his demonstration and provided parents an opportunity to practice the correct method of resuscitation.

It was pointed out by West that the primary cause of accidental death in babies is suffocation. "Immediate resuscitation is necessary in

cases of air-supply cut-off as the brain can survive only three to five minutes without oxygen," stated West.

A film entitled, "The Breath of Life" was shown to the group by Inspector to complete the program.
