Library to Get Kennedy 'Hearings'

A complete set of the 26 volumes of testimony and exhibits comprising the "Hearings Before the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy" is being sent to the Torrance Public Library, 1345 Post Ave.

Published by the United States Government Printing Office, the account of the hearings and the exhibits totals 17,827 pages including indexes. The 15 volumes of testimony before the Commission run 10,015 pages and there are 7,812 pages of exhibits, including photographs, maps, charts, documents, letters and similar items. Seven other regional headquarters libraries of the Los Angeles Library system will also receive a complete set of the 26 volumes, according to William S. Geller, county librarian.
