**Civic Leaders, Builders To Preview Homes Friday**

More than 200 civic and business leaders of the Southwest area will join a score of home building dignitaries Friday afternoon as guests of builder Ray Watt, developer of Palo del Amo Woods, in a "VIP Preview" of the distinctive new home community, announces Phil Walsh, vice president for sales.

The public is invited to the grand opening of the development of 900 balanced power homes on Saturday and Sunday, May 22 and 23.

The seven beautifully furnished and landscaped model homes located on Sepulveda Boulevard just one-half mile west of the Harbor Freeway, were to be open to the public beginning at 10 a.m. until dark on Saturday and daily thereafter.

VISITORS to the 228-acre Palo del Amo Woods development will pass through an attractively landscaped entrance guarded by two dancing water fountains. Directly beyond is the unique "Flowerland of the Woods," a rolling green grass vista highlighted by many 30 foot high pine trees and 30 different varieties of flowers — all blooming!

The garden scene of shrubs and trees was designed by Jack Neelon, landscape designer of Builders Landscape Grading, Inc. The designer selected the flowering ground cover, boulders, stepping stones, weathered railroad ties, and a quaint footbridge with the aim of maintaining the woody atmosphere of Palo del Amo Woods.

When completed the encircled community, surrounded by a six foot high block wall will boast more than 4,000 trees planted by developer Watt. Three pine trees will be planted on each lot.

ALL UTILITIES at the Watt-built community of distinctive homes are underground—out of sight forever! Unique among new home developments at Palo del Amo Woods is the new homeowner's design service pro-

vided by John K. Barraclough Interiors in the new Merchandising Center. Here the home buyer will receive assistance in coordinating the interior color scheme as well as advice in the selection and purchase of draperies, furniture, floor coverings, wall coverings and accessories.

Among the seven available models are three homes which were chosen to be exhibited in past years as a featured attraction at the Los Angeles Home Show.

**THE LUXURIOUS** three-, four-, and five-bedroom homes, all with three baths, include the most honored home in Southern California—the Diamond Head, the hit of the 1964 Home Show—the Hillhaven; and the latest entry into the Watt-parade of fine homes, the Continental, to be shown for the first time during the 1965 Los Angeles Home Show. (The Continental will be open for public viewing after the show in June.) Other popular models available at Palo del Amo Woods are the Washingtonian, the Cambridge, the Woodridge, and the Sandhurst.

All models feature tri-level living, and are individually styled in more than 40 widely-varying exteriors creating the custom home look within



THEY INCLUDE a large rumpus room for informal entertaining, a separate family and dining room, and are carpeted wall-to-wall.

**Harvey Plans Expansion During Year**

Net income for Harvey Aluminum for the first six months ending March 31 was \$2,691,478 compared to \$2,229,004 for the same period last year. Sales for the first half totaled \$37,335,067, compared to \$37,386,023 for the like six months a year earlier.

"The expansion projects to assure the continued progress and growth of the company are progressing," Lawrence A. Harvey said.

"Major facilities in the expansion program include an aluminum rolling mill in Lewisport, Kentucky; alumina plant in St. Croix, Virgin Islands; and bauxite development in the Republic of Guinea, Africa. The Alnor project in Norway, where the company and Norsk Hydro are developing an aluminum reduction and fabricating complex, is under construction."
