location interviews now being conducted. Mosley said the interviews, which seek to determine the needs of persons for whom the city will have new housing, were "making the natives restless."
Mosley, who spoke as an individual, fears the interviews might result in vacancies in his own rental property before the city actually acquires.
Ferraro said the interviews were part of the work necessary for the completion of one phase of the project. The city hopes to complete the first phase by November, he said, and that deadline puts the project on a crash basis.
He then explained the relocation interviews are 20 per cent complete, while a structural survey of the area is 70 per cent complete. Both are necessary in the first phase, he said, and he had directed the work under the assumption that the council's directive "to move as fast as possible" is still in effect.
"That's what we wanted to know," Beasley said, ending the debate. The council reaffirmed its desire to proceed as rapidly as possible with the project, but asked Ferraro to prepare a written report on the progress to date.

"I won't spend any more than some of the rest of us spend," Vico also reminded councilmen that Lyman has made no major trips since he was elected to office, while other members have attended several meetings.
"Everything else was available to Mr. Lyman," Mayor Albert Isen commented. Isen said such a trip might set a precedent for other "inter-continental" trips.
Vico's motion failed, 2-4 with J. A. Beasley abstaining. "I don't know anything about this," Ken Miller said, "you're forcing a vote."
Following the vote, Vico told councilmen, "From now on I think we ought to cancel all trips and save a lot of money." He also said he didn't intend to take any more trips and added, "a convention is a convention—when you get down to it, it's a farce."
"Don't go, it's your own leg," Miller commented.

IN OTHER action, the council:

- Approved a zone change from C-4 to C-3 for property leased to the Rolling Hills Plaza Co., subject to a storm drain easement.
- Adopted a resolution prohibiting left turns from Hawthorne Avenue into the Del Amo Center parking lot.
- Authorized capital improvements projects which will provide new restrooms at El Retiro Park and new equipment rooms at Entradero, Guenser, La Romeria, and Victor parks. A total of \$32,000 to cover the costs of construction was appropriated.
- Approved plans and appropriated money for the construction of a parking lot at city hall. The lot will provide 35 additional spaces on the east side of the building.
- Voted to oppose an application for an on-sale beer license at 4626 Del Amo Blvd.

Once again the papers and banners around the city remind us that it is Torrance Beautiful Month and time to clean-up, paint-up, and fix-up our community. But one has only to look about with an open eye to see how little beauty there is to emphasize in Torrance.
For example, as one drives under the banner-embazoned (Torrance Beautiful and Armed Forces Day) and political-poster plastered railway bridge at 190th and Hawthorne, the roadway on either side is unrelieved by any vestige of beauty; no greenery competes with the chain-link fence and the telephone poles

moved as part of street improvement efforts with no subsequent replacement or substitution. We have no graceful boulevards, except as noted above, no fountains, no areas of still beauty, indeed no truly planned areas of beauty even within our parks, achieved by a certain restraint, dignity, and nobility which requires liberal use of large trees and other greenery, fountains, some statuary, peaceful shaded areas, and limitations on the number, size, and placement of advertising signs. Beauty does not naturally occur within the city, but must be planned and provided for. It will not be accomplished by volunteer trash pickup or posting of banners.
The lack of a comprehensive master plan for civic growth was long an issue in
