



Former Student at ECC Now Teaching in Greece

Optimism, hard work and a pleasing personality have proven keys to success for George Poupis, a resident of Greece who attended El Camino College in 1961-63.

Miss Henrietta Martin, assistant director of student personnel at El Camino, said Poupis, now employed by the Shell Oil Co. in Thessaloniki, Greece, is teaching English at a foreign language school.

"George was always a hard worker at El Camino, and his optimistic spirit and good personality made many friends for him while he was here," Miss Martin said.

POUPLIS is the nephew of Father Naoum Nitsiotis, pastor of the Greek Orthodox Church of Redondo Beach.

The foreign student came to this country in 1961 in hopes of completing a college education.

He may have met that goal but, as a citizen of Greece, he was drafted by the Greek army in 1963, after attending El Camino for two years.

POUPLIS participated in many activities at El Camino. Majoring in political science, he became interested in campus politics and served on the Associated Men Students board in 1963.

Like many foreign students, Poupis was able to bridge the gap between the cultures of his homeland and the United States.

Miss Martin recalls that in volleyball games, Poupis utilized techniques of soccer, such as hitting the ball with the top of his head in putting the volleyball across the net.

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IN A RECENT letter to Miss Martin, Poupis asked for copies of El Camino College yearbook and current news magazines to use as guides for ideas in his English classes.

Although the Greek army shortened his stay in the USA, Poupis has returned with some significant experiences from this country, and in return, has left a lasting impression here.
